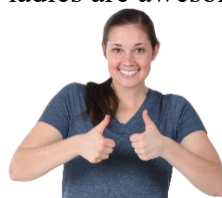

For September's meeting your second 2026 Row by Row needs to be completed for a special show and tell.

2026 Row by Row II

2026 Row by Row **II** Runs

from August 2026 to January 2027

Participants: Janet, Lorna, Christine, Debbie, Nancy, Pam, and Cindy

Your first row (using YOUR FQ) is due for a special show-and-tell at August's meeting. If you are one of the three members (Janet, Nancy, and Debbie) who went with the 7th row, rows one and two must be completed by the August meeting.

Except for the first row, it is the maker's choice on which FQ to use in each consecutive row. Your rows will contain (6) 8" blocks, of which at least 3 blocks must contain fabric from the provided FQ. For those working with 6 FQs, your top will measure 48x48; for those working with 7 FQs, your top will measure 48x54.

Participants who complete the quilt from your Row by Row II and turn it over to Piecemakers by the March 2027 meeting will have their name entered into a \$50 drawing.

#1 At **July's** meeting: You will receive a bag containing 1 of your FQ's plus 5 additional FQ's from players.

#2 At **August's** meeting, you will have your first row completed. **The FQ to be used for the first row is the one you turned in!** The block size is 8" and any technique. The FQ fabric must be obviously displayed. The minimum row size is 6 blocks, and at least 3 blocks must contain the FQ fabric.



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#3 At September's meeting, your second completed row needs to be

sewn to the first row. **YOU choose the FQ to use.** The block can be the same as the one in the previous row, or you can choose another. The only rule is that block size, blocks per row, and the number of blocks containing the FQ fabric must remain the same as stated in #3 / SEPTEMBER.

#4: At the October through January meetings, the third through sixth rows will be completed. The rules that apply are exactly the same as those stated in #4 / September. Pick a FQ, make a row, sew to the previous row. By January, the quilt tops are finished.

#5 Optional: If you choose to complete your quilt and turn it over to Piecemakers by the March 2027 meeting, your name will go in for a \$50 gift certificate drawing.

Meeting called to order at 9:35 a.m.

May minutes accepted as written, 1st by Jackie Blazok, 2nd by Shelly Yarrington

Three people donated their completed Row by Row quilts to Piecemakers. Shelly Yarrington won the \$50 drawing. Next Row by Row fat quarters were due today. Everyone participating will pick up their fat quarters after the meeting.

Eleanor Yura will begin putting together a nominating committee to find members to run for Treasurer, Vice President, Historian and Secretary. Please talk to Eleanor if you are interested in being on the committee or if you are interested in running for one of the open positions. You need to be a member in good standing for 2 years to hold a position on the Board. The Vice President will move up to President. If you only want to do the quilting, bring them back and someone else will trim, bind, put on a label, measure and bag them. We work as a team, everyone doing what they can. Please help out in any way you can. We are all

Members who meet for Piecemakers on Mondays sandwich quilts most weeks. If you are able to quilt a top or 2 just let Cindy or Nancy know and we can get the tops ready for quilting however you want them prepared. We find backing fabric and make the backings to fit the quilt top. We can baste with pins, spray or just sandwich the three layers ready for a long arm. Bindings and labels are also available and can be put with a quilt. If you don't want to do the binding but would like to do the quilting you can bring it back quilted and someone else will trim, bind and label. We work as a team. Each quilt is usually touched by several people. It would be really nice to reduce the number of tops we are storing. Cindy has been doing really well on delivering finished quilts and we need to have more ready for delivery. Please volunteer in any way that you can.

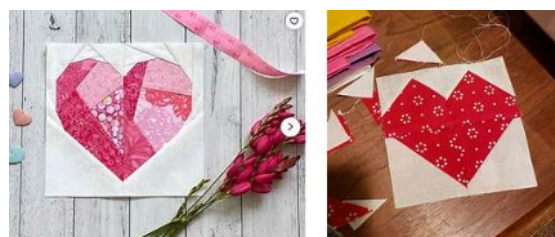

**AS A REMINDER our
Block of the Month**

➤ Each month YOU will be provided with an FQ to use within your block. The FQ fabric will be the same each month, so if you win more than one month, you can combine the blocks from each win. You will get a sampler of blocks with uniformity throughout the rest of this year.



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➤ Now here is the great news...you get to pick the 12-1/2" unfinished block of your choice. The only requirement is that you must prominently use the provided FQ in your block...again, uniformity. You can piece, applique, paper piece, etc., whatever you want, but just be sure to use the FQ fabric provided somewhere within the block. BUT, BUT, BUT you cannot use the same block twice or more within the next six months. Each block within the BOM period MUST BE DIFFERENT.

➤ Blocks will be measured 12-1/2" unfinished

➤ You start with one FQ; the only way you can get your next FQ is to enter your block in the BOM drawing during the meeting.

➤ What happens if you make your block for one month, but then you cannot attend? Good news, use it for the next meeting you can attend! As there is no specific block per month, the blocks can be used anytime.

Recap of rules

* Rule #1: The block must contain somewhere within it some of the FQ fabric I provided. The fabric must be used so it is prominently seen within the block. In case of lost FQ, see Rule #5

* Rule #2: your choice of 12-1/2" block pattern. Any pattern and any technique can be used. Please attach a paper with the **name of your block** on it. For example: Square-in a- Square, Pieced, Debbie Sprague

* Rule #3: Once you use a block pattern, it cannot be used again within the BOM trial period.

* Rule #4: Sorry, ladies, blocks will be measured. A 12-1/2" unfinished block must measure at least 12-1/2" unfinished, if you have a block that can be cut down great, if you can't then I can't accept it. Bigger is better, but to "cut down to 12-1/2" it will mean the block's visual integrity will not be jeopardized. If the cutting down destroys points, it just won't work.

Rule #5: If you lose your FQ, you may get a replacement FQ at the cost of \$5.00

Since I run the Boutique, Debbie Sprague, President, will help me measure the blocks, log your block name for the newsletter, and hand out FQs for the following month.

2026 Staycation Small Quilt Swap

FIFTY DOLLARS FOR A FUN FILLED TWO DAY EVENT! BETTER HURRY THE EVENT IS FILLING UP QUICKLY!

2026 Staycation is a two-day event. To show off our talents, we will be holding another Small Quilt Swap. The swap will be held following our General Meeting the last day of 2026's Staycation. This means even members not attending the Staycation but go to the General Meeting can participate. A "Thank You" gift will be given to all participants. Here are the rules. please read carefully as there are a couple changes from previous swaps

1. Make a small quilt using these three fabric colors: **BLACK / WHITE / AND YOUR FAVORITE COLOR**

2. Your small quilt can be any shape, as long as the outer dimensions are no smaller than 72" and no bigger than 96". For example, an 18x18-square small quilt will equal 72", a 24x24-square quilt will equal 96", and an 18"x24" oblong quilt will equal 84". Starting in 2026, we will measure the quilts to verify they meet the small quilt size requirements. Please measure your quilt before submitting it; I don't want to disqualify it.

3. Small Quilts must be completed before the event, as they will be displayed all day Friday through the General Meeting Saturday. If you cannot attend the meeting, please give the quilts to Jeannette Smith during QADM or to me.

4. Front-batting-backing, quilted, and edges bound

5. Your quilt must have a Label on the back and needs to include:

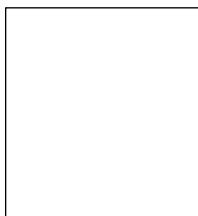

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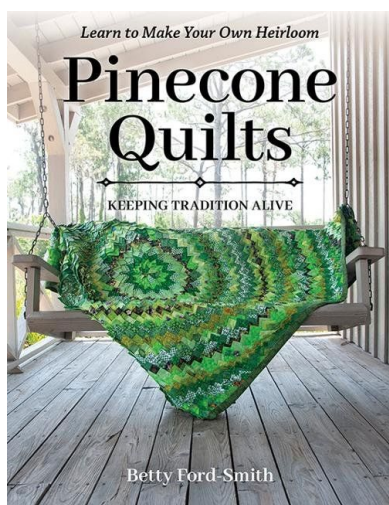
